In addition to the pilings, the project includes improvements to the parking and access facilities, new floating docks & gangway, and a small vessel launch ramp.

Funding Challenges


The project relies on grant funding, Port savings, and a \$700,000 bond. Despite securing two grants, a 2022 survey revealed additional costs for replacing 17 pilings. A third emergency grant was submitted, but a significant funding shortfall remains. To address this, the Port plans to sell a lot on Illahee Road and a house on Ocean View Blvd.

ILLAHEE STORE RENOVATION

The renovation of the former Illahee Foods store (purchased by the Port at a Sheriff's sale) requires environmental remediation, specifically the removal of the leaking gasoline USTs (underground storage tanks). A Cleanup Grant has been secured and awaits contractor selection, with plans to complete in 2025. Your donation will help bring about the revigoration of this central hub of our area.
